

# **Grade 9 Registration Information 2022-23**

We are looking forward to welcoming you to Grade 9 - your final year of junior high!

Lakeland Ridge is a K-9 school that follows a 6-day, 6 period timetable. Just as in grades 7 and 8, grade 9 students will take a combination of "core" courses and "complementary" courses.

Core courses are courses that all students take, as mandated by Alberta Education. They are English Language Arts, Health, Math, Physical Education, Science, and Social Studies.

Complementary courses are courses that are more often referred to as option courses. These are the courses that students choose based on areas of interest. Students at Lakeland Ridge take 6 complementary courses throughout the year. The complementary courses are split into 2 semesters, meaning students will take 3 complementary courses during Semester 1 (September - January) and 3 complementary courses in Semester 2 (February - June). However, if a student selects French, they will take French for the full year. Therefore, if students select French, this will count as 2 courses in their group of 6.

All fees charged for complementary courses are cost-recovery. The course fee covers supplies that are consumed during the course. The field trip fee covers the expected expenses of anticipated field trip(s). Field trips are excellent opportunities for students to experience the course's learning outcomes in a unique way outside of the classroom. The field trip fee is paid at the beginning of each semester so teachers can plan and budget for the proposed field trips. Field trips are optional for students. Therefore, families can make the decision to opt out of the field trip fee. If the decision is made to opt out of the field trip fee, students will not attend the course's planned field trip(s). Students will still be expected to attend school those days and work will be provided. For course field trips to move forward, a minimum number of students opting in will be required. There are three courses where opting out of the field trip is not an option: Performing Arts, Recreational Fitness, and Technical Theatre. The Performing Arts and Technical Theatre field trip is an all-day, in-class workshop with outside guest experts who are paid a fee to come in and host sessions. Recreational Fitness is a field trip-based course. If students do not wish to participate in Recreational Fitness field trips, Sports Acceleration would be a good alternative option to choose.

Below is the list of complementary courses offered to Grade 9s at Lakeland Ridge. The list includes a variety of courses representing a diverse range of interest areas. There are also a number of no-cost and low-cost options for families. Following the list are course descriptions and course fees.

Students, in consultation with their parents will identify and rank their top 9 course choices (1 being most desired, 9 being least desired). The administrative team at Lakeland Ridge will do its best to accommodate students' requests. In some cases, due to lack of student interest, courses in the list may not be offered as courses require a minimum number of students to move ahead.

#### ART 9

Course Fee - \$14.50 Field Trip - \$30.00

In Art 9, students will have first-hand opportunities to create and express themselves, as well as appreciate and critique other artist's work. They will experience a wide variety of projects that may include painting, printmaking, soapstone, glass mosaics, inking and pastels while also honing their drawing and sketching skills. Students will study techniques and methods used by local, Indigenous and international artists; while learning about the societal significance of many different forms of art.

#### **CONSTRUCTION 9**

(Formally Known as Advanced Construction)

Course Fee - \$55

This course is designed for students that are interested in learning how to empower themselves to build and create a custom wood project. Popular projects include: Mini-Baseball Bats, Regulation Baseball Bat, Drum Sticks, Mini-Hockey Sticks, Ping-Pong Paddle Sets, Longboards, Skateboards, Skimboards, Cutting Boards, Shadow Boxes, Shelves, Picture Frames, Wall Art, Store Quality Signs, Small Furniture Pieces, and much, much more. Students gain the knowledge and skills to create a custom project or modify existing project plans to suit their needs. At the end of this course you can take pride in the project you create and you will take a significant step forward in your personal development as a skilled builder.

#### **CULINARY ARTS 9**

(Formally Known as World Foods)

Course Fee - \$55.00

Love to cook? Students will further develop their cooking expertise as they learn new techniques and prepare new recipes. The main focus of this course will be on the preparation of meal items influenced from flavours found around the world. Students will have the opportunity to develop a "food truck" menu and will learn advertising strategies to promote their fare for a food truck showcase.

# **DESIGN PRODUCTION 9**

(Formally Known as Pottery)

Course Fee - \$50.00

Interested in learning how to work with clay? This course will provide an introduction and build on techniques needed to create beautiful hand built pieces. Students will also be introduced to the pottery wheel.

#### **DESIGN STUDIES 9**

(Formally Known as Creative Crafts)

Course Fee - \$25.00

The course is hands-on where students develop and refine their fine motor skills by working with materials in new and creative ways. Project considerations include paper crafts, textile art, yarn, wood and vinyl crafts, painting, and other mediums. Students learn the basics of various crafts and hobbies and then use those techniques to express themselves in creative and tangible ways. Majority of supplies are provided and students are encouraged to use upcycled materials when materials are needed from home.

## **DIGITAL DESIGN 9**

(Formally Known as Digital Media and Design)

Course Fee - \$25.00

This course is for students interested in creating projects that allow them to explore techniques for applying traditional art techniques and computer aided graphic work to: posters, cartoons, comics, logo's, signs, t-shirts, coffee mugs, and stickers. In addition to these projects students will also have the ability to create stunning 3D renderings for: video game characters, interior and exterior design, and architecture. Students can also create original artwork (sketches, drawings, paintings) and will have the ability to enhance them digitally if desired.

#### DRAMA 9

Course Fee - \$5.00

Field Trip - \$21.00

The drama program fosters a positive self-concept in students by encouraging them to explore life and express themselves. Students will participate in a variety of activities, using both bodies and voices as tools. Classes will include active games, improvisation, theatre sports, scripted acting, and creative group projects - all geared toward self-knowledge, connection, collaboration, and of course extreme fun.

# **ENTERPRISE AND INNOVATION 9**

(Formally Known as App Savvy)

Course Fee - \$10.50

This course uses a project-based and problem-solving approach to teach students a variety of technology and next generation internet skills that go beyond basic computer skills. Through individual and group work, students will learn applications that increase their understanding of and ability with technology.

#### **FASHION STUDIES 9**

(Formally Known as Textile Arts)

Course Fee - \$15.00

This course provides students with an opportunity to explore their creativity and develop important life skills. Students will have the opportunity to make a variety of projects using a sewing machine, serger, an embroidery machine, and a vinyl cutting machine. Project choices include but are not limited to; pyjama pants, hoodie, onesie or a project of personal choice. Students are responsible for providing the majority of the supplies for their projects. Previous sewing experience is not

necessary.

#### FOODS 9

(Formally Known as Fast and Convenient Foods)

Course Fee - \$65.00

Students will build on their cooking skills as they learn new techniques and prepare various new recipes. Budget, time and quality of foods will be considered as they participate in a number of Master Chef styled black box challenges. Students will also learn the art of cake decorating by participating in the "LLR Cupcake Design Challenge".

# FRENCH AS A SECOND LANGUAGE 9 - Full Year Course

(This will count as 2 courses of 6 that students will take.)

Course Fee - No Cost

Field Trip - \$35.50

Students with no previous French experience may take French 9. This class challenges students to learn a second language in a fun and innovative way! Students will study the following subject areas: animals, clothing, and food. Students will be required to participate in oral classroom activities and complete written assignments.

#### **LEADERSHIP 9**

Course Fee - \$16

Students will learn skills to develop and enhance their leadership capacity. Students will commit to adopting a leadership role within the school and community. This will include team leader responsibilities in areas such as: student interest groups, liaising with staff on school matters and governance, event/activity planning and implementation, humanitarian involvement, mentoring, school spirit, etc.

#### **MANAGEMENT AND MARKETING 9**

(Formally Known as Bookmark-eting)

Course Fee - \$40.00

Are you a budding entrepreneur? Do you want to learn the fundamentals of marketing and promoting a business? In this class students will choose a novel to read and to analyze. They will then create a book launch campaign promoting the novel. Students will enjoy a book club atmosphere while learning the fundamentals of marketing and promotion.

#### **OUTDOOR EDUCATION 9**

Course Fee - \$36.50

Field Trip - \$31.50

Camping - \$165.00

Outdoor Education consists of three components: environment (living things & ecological processes), outdoor (basic knowledge, skills & attitudes for safe, comfortable, outdoor experiences) and personal/team development (understanding, respect, and appreciation for self & others). The course will include field trips, indoor and outdoor activities, as well as classroom projects. An optional overnight camping trip is also an exciting part of the course.

#### PERFORMING ARTS 9

Course Fee - \$5.00

Field Trip - \$21.00\*mandatory fee

Calling all performers, designers, and technicians! We are looking for students who want to learn

everything musical theatre! This class gives first hand experience with all elements involved in putting on a large scale theatrical production. If you love acting, the artistic design aspect, or have an interest in technical theatre, this class allows you to explore each of the career paths. Students do not need to take Performing Arts in order to audition for the school's musical production. This is different from previous years.

#### PHOTOGRAPHY 9

Course Fee - \$10.50

The photography program is designed to teach students the theoretical and technical aspects of digital photography. Students will use digital cameras and associated computer hardware and software for creating, modifying, and producing images.

#### **RECREATIONAL FITNESS 9**

Course Fee - \$21.00

Field Trip - \$159 \*mandatory fee

This course is open to students who have previously demonstrated a positive attitude and genuine interest in PE. Course content includes fitness and training principles, sports safety, and an appreciation for sports leisure activities. It will encourage a healthy attitude combined with fair play and sportsmanship in recreational activities. Students will participate in a wide variety of sports, individual pursuits, and fitness activities, both on and off-site. Please note that swimming is a required element of this course. Students who cannot swim will be given basic skill instruction in order to participate.

#### **SPORTS ACCELERATION 9**

Course Fee - \$16.50

Field Trip - \$17.00

The goal of the course is to allow students to gain an understanding of sports training, anatomy, and physiology. They will be instructed in and practice proper training in every discipline of sporting mastery. Students will gain greater knowledge of nutrition, anaerobic and aerobic training, biomechanics, as well as technical sport practice so they may implement personal training for their chosen school or community sport.

# \*EXTRA-CURRICULAR OPPORTUNITY\* LLR WOLVES THEATRE PRODUCTION

Students do not choose this as an option. Information will be provided to students in September. Lakeland Wolves Production Extra-Curricular

Fee - \$131.00

All junior high students will have the opportunity to audition for our musical production. Students who sign up for this extra-curricular activity will be rehearsing, or working on technical theatre elements after school. Some Saturday rehearsals will be held as well. There will also be some dress rehearsals leading up to the show. Students do not need to take Performing Arts in order to be in the school's musical production. This is different from previous years.
