From The Principal's Desk



My name is Jeff Huculak and I am honored to serve as the principal of Lakeland Ridge School. I hope you all enjoyed your summer and had an opportunity to rest and relax with friends and family. I would like to welcome everyone to a new school year and briefly introduce myself to our new Lakeland Ridge families. It's great to back!

I want to share some highlights about a few improvements and purchases we made for this upcoming school year. Some of these improvements include:

- Removed 'half walls' in fifteen classrooms to maximize space
- Upgraded wireless presentation system in both the Kona and Mukluk gyms
- Installed a new projector in the Kona gym
- Replaced the projector bulb in the Mukluk gym and performed other maintenance
- Relocated the score clock to the corner of the Kona gym
- Purchased 34 new Chromebooks
- Purchased 3 new Spin bikes for the fitness room
- Purchased new tables and chairs for division one

August 29 and 30 were the first two operational days of the school year for staff. During this time staff took part in professional learning, attended meetings, and worked in collaborative teams. Both days were very productive and provided staff with a great start to the new school year. In addition, some of our staff also attended a 4-day Lucy Calkins' workshop last week, which focused on Reader's Workshop.

LLR Personal Communication Device Policy

In alignment with <u>Elk Island Public Schools' Personal Communication Devices Board Policy 24</u>, effective September 1, 2019, Lakeland Ridge has established a Personal Communication Device (PCD) Policy. Personal communication devices (PCDs) are any personal digital devices that connect to the internet through WiFi, cellular network or other mobile devices.

Students in Kindergarten through Grade 6 are not allowed access/use of a PCD at school at any time during regular school hours including morning and lunch breaks. If devices are brought to school, they are to remain in student lockers or backpacks.

Students in Grades 7 through 9 are not allowed access/use of a PCD at school at any time during regular school hours except during morning break (between periods 2-3) and during the second portion of the lunch hour (12:14 - 12:37). Devices that are brought to school are expected to stay in student lockers at all times except during the two aforementioned breaks.

Lunch Information



Elementary students in Kindergarten to grade 6 eat lunch in their classroom with lunch supervisors provided. Each classroom has a microwave for students to use. Due to the high demand on our microwaves and the limited time in which to warm up lunch items, we would appreciate it if all items are cooked at home therefore only needing a short warm-up. We would like to let

our grade 7 and 8 students and families know that beginning this year, students will be eating

lunch in the Mukluk gym. Students will be able to interact with their grade 7 and/or 8 peers while visiting at tables, along benches, or if they choose on the floor. Students expressed that they would like to have more flexibility with who they visit with during the eating portion of lunch. Last year, students ate their lunch in specific groupings and classrooms. We hope that by having all grade 7 and 8 students in one larger space, students will have a broader choice in who they would like to create and maintain different connections with. Our grade 9 students will continue to eat as a group in the Gathering Area during this time. We would also like to remind students and families, that students are not permitted the use of personal devices during the eating portion of lunch break. <u>Please note</u>: The school does not supply utensils, so please send all required forks and spoons.

Nut AWARE School



We are proud to be a nut aware school. Because nuts can cause severe, life-threatening reactions in some of our students and staff, we ask that you do not send food items that contain peanut butter/peanuts/all tree nuts and sesame seeds. Thank you for helping us provide a safe environment for all in our school community.

Student Medication and Medical Concerns

If a parent/guardian requests that their child be administered medication while at school, he/she must complete a "Medication/Personal Care Request and Authorization" form. The completed form and medication should be brought to the school's main office. This form needs to be completed for every change in medication and dosage. Non-prescription drugs such as acetaminophen, cold remedies, and inhalants may not be administered to students without the signed consent forms.

If your child has a dangerous anaphylactic allergy to a particular substance, parents/guardians must complete an "Emergency Anaphylactic Allergy Alert" form. Parents/guardians are advised that the preferred location for the storage of Epi-pens and inhalers is in fanny packs worn by the student. If parents prefer that Epi-pens and/or inhalers be located in alternate locations, they must specify this on the form and sign the request. For the well-being of students, Elk Island Public Schools requires parents to complete medical forms on an ANNUAL basis and for every change in medication and dosage. If you require a form for medication, allergy alerts, or anaphylaxis please either fill out the appropriate form found on our website or contact Mrs. Shrimpton in the office to have one sent home with your son/daughter.

Pay School Fees Online!

School fee information for the 2019-20 school year is expected to be posted on the PowerSchool Parent Portal by the end of September. All fees are due within 30 days of being posted. To access your fee information, simply log in to the PowerSchool Parent Portal and go to "Student Fees." There you can view your fees and pay them online using Visa, MasterCard or INTERAC Online—when available from your financial institution.

Don't forget to log in to the PowerSchool Parent Portal regularly throughout the year. Fees are often added to your child's account to cover the cost of various school activities such as field trips, class projects, athletic-team fees and more. Additionally, junior high and senior high fees can change if courses are added and deleted.

If circumstances exist where you are unable to pay your student fees you can apply to have fees waived by submitting an Application for a Waiver of Fees. The application deadline is Dec. 15, 2019.

Leader in Me 7 Habits Week

As a part of our character education programming, we have been happy to be a Leader in Me School for the past 8 years. The Leader in Me focuses on teaching students all about 'The 7 Habits of Highly Effective People'. Over the next week, our K-6 students will work on 'The First 7 Days' in which they will focus on specific habit lessons. Our junior high students will participate in the 7 Habits Workshop all day Wednesday, September 4. Programming will focus on immersing students in the language and strategies of living the 7 habits. Student Drop-Off

There is NO student drop off or stopping permitted in the bus lanes on Crimson Drive. Those lanes are a school bus zone and our school buses need to remain on schedule to get EIPS students to school on time.

Also, please respect the "Kiss and Go" zone located in the drop off lane in front of the school. There is signage indicating that there is NO PARKING from 8:15-9:15am and from 2:30-3:30pm. Please do not leave your vehicle unattended during this time. If you need to park, please use the designated stalls in our parking lot.



Don't get a Ticket -

There has been an increased police presence around the school to ensure students are safe on their way to and from school. Police have handed tickets out for the following:

- Stopping in the bus lane
- Failure to come to a complete stop
- Speeding

A reminder that when a vehicle turns left onto Crimson Drive from the parking lot before 4pm, parents may be ticketed as there are cameras. Please help to keep our students safe.

Orange Shirt Day - September 30

Five years ago, Williams Lake, British Columbia hosted a memorial event for the St. Joseph Mission (SJM) School. Former students were given a chance to share their memories from their time at residential schools, and the community took a step toward reconciliation by acknowledging and honouring their experiences.

One student, Phyllis, told a story of having her brand new orange shirt taken away on her first day of residential school. The poignancy of her tale has inspired schools in British Columbia, and across Canada, to put on orange shirts of their own to celebrate reconciliation in their own communities. **Orange Shirt Day happens this year on September 30**, and is an opportunity for teachers, students, parents, and other community members to wear an orange shirt and open up a discussion on all aspects of residential schools.

Milk Cards



Milk Cards will now be available for purchase online starting September 16 in your parent portal. Any milk cards purchased online after 8:00 AM on a school day will not be available until the following school day. The cost for a milk card is \$10 dollars for 8 milks. Milk will be available for students starting Tuesday, September 24 and milk cards will expire June 2020. Students are still welcome to purchase milk cards in the office.

Raising Dough

Each time the families of Lakeland Ridge School purchase a product at COBS Bread, (Lakeland Ridge branch), and they mention Lakeland Ridge School, COBS staff will process 5% of the total sale back to Lakeland Ridge School.

Volunteers in Schools

With a responsibility of protecting all of the students in its care, Elk Island Public Schools has a volunteer procedure which states that all volunteers, regardless of scope, will be required to annually sign a form including a declaration that they do not have a criminal record or a child welfare record, as well as agreeing to a confidentiality undertaking. Volunteers who have an increased level of personal contact with students, such as a coach or supervisor on an extended (overnight) field trip will also be required to complete an application form and provide the results of a criminal record check. The fee for the criminal record check is waived for all EIPS' volunteers. EIPS values and appreciates the efforts of all volunteers.

Friendly Reminder to Parents

Please ensure that your child knows where he or she is to go at the end of the day and how they are to get there (bus, walk, being picked up). A good way to help your child with this information is to put a note in the agenda. This lets your child know where to go, and also helps teachers and other staff members ensure your child is going to the right place at the end of the day. Thank you for helping us keep your child safe. In some cases, parents are phoning the school daily to have messages passed along to students, but this too can cause undue anxiety for children as they wait for word from parents. As the school office is a very hectic place, especially at the beginning and end of the day, a child will not receive the message. This could mean your child is in an unsupervised and possibly unsafe situation after school.

Parents/Relative Visiting During School Hours

ALL parents and/or relatives who volunteer or visit in the building or on the grounds <u>are required</u> <u>to check in at the office (and pick up an ID tag)</u> before going to your child's classroom or activity. We make this request for the safety and well-being of all of our students. Our staff and children need to know that every adult in our facility and on the grounds is someone that they can trust. Thank you for your cooperation.

No Child Without

In our ongoing effort to provide safe and caring schools for our students, Elk Island Public Schools (EIPS) has completed its registration in the *No Child Without* program and all eligible schools, including Lakeland Ridge, are now enrolled. *No Child Without* is a joint program of the Canadian MedicAlert Foundation and the Lions Club of Canada. Through this program, registered children receive 24-hour MedicAlert coverage free of charge between their fourth and fourteenth birthdays. *No Child Without* waives all initial registration fees and ongoing membership costs during these years.

If your child has a serious medical condition or allergy and would benefit from MedicAlert services, please contact the school to obtain a program information pamphlet. You can then enroll in *No Child Without* by calling 1-877-282-5378 or online at <u>www.nochildwithout.ca</u>. If your child is already registered with MedicAlert and you would like to enroll specifically in the *No Child Without* program, you must sign up by telephone at the number above.

Quick Facts: EIPS buses are all equipped with video surveillance

Did you know each EIPS bus is equipped with video surveillance? The video surveillance and equipment helps:

- ensure the safety of all students, drivers and property; and
- deter from destructive acts.

On a regular basis, EIPS Student Transportation reviews the video recordings, in accordance with the *Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act* (FOIP). The recordings assist the department with monitoring student and driver conduct, and may be used as evidence in a disciplinary matter.

Caregiver Education Series
