Reports

a. EIPS Board Trustee

- Welcome Trustee Jim Seutter. Trustee presented his report. Refer to the full <u>Trustee</u> <u>Report on the school website</u>. Board meetings are always available <u>online</u>.
- Board meetings typically open to the public; with COVID-19 protocols, it is now accessible via <u>EIPS YouTube channel</u> to listen in.
- 3 Year Capital plan activities underway. Sherwood Heights and Campbelltown are top priorities. Province approved funding for design of Sherwood Heights.
- Budget discussions underway. Reserve funds will be allocated as there is discussion province wants smaller reserves. School fees and funding cuts to small schools two items of key discussions to keep it financially feasible.
- Curriculum implementation delay concerns submitted to the Province.
- Gas subsidy (transportation) request to the Province has been submitted.
- There were no questions posed to Trustee Seutter.

Budgets are being sent to schools on April 22. Once we see the budget, we will be able to make key decisions.

3. New Curriculum – EIPS will not be piloting the draft curriculum.

The province announced it is rolling out the new kindergarten to Grade 6 curriculum using a phased-in approach, starting fall 2022. Alberta Education decided not to introduce all subjects at the same time. Instead, it will introduce three subjects — mathematics, English language arts and literature, and physical education and wellness — and the remaining five later.

TIMELINES

April 2022: Curriculum release

Alberta Education will release the final curriculum for:

- mathematics kindergarten to Grade 3;
- English language arts and literature kindergarten to Grade 3; and
- physical education and wellness kindergarten to Grade 6.

April to August 2022: Prepare and build capacity

- EIPS-based curriculum teachers will develop lesson plans, professional learning tools and teaching resources to support teachers implementing the new curriculum; and
- EIPS will host ongoing professional learning sessions to ensure the Division, school administration and elementary teachers are properly prepared to implement all three subjects and support students with the roll-out in fall 2022.

September 2022: First phase of the curriculum roll-out

All elementary schools, provincewide, will implement the new curriculum for:

- mathematics kindergarten to Grade 3
- English language arts and literature kindergarten to Grade 3
- physical education and wellness kindergarten to Grade 6

September 2023: Second phase of the curriculum roll-out

All elementary schools, provincewide, will implement the new curriculum for:

- mathematics grades 4 to 6
- English language arts and literature grades 4 to 6

4. Junior High Option Course Selections

 Last week both Mr. Huculak, Mrs. Williams and Mrs. Candler visited the grade 6, 7 and 8 classes. The deadline to complete option selections is this Thursday, April 14. Placement in options is not based on a first-come/ first-served basis, however students who submit their option selections after the deadline may be given less consideration. Information was also sent out via School Messenger and can also be found on our website.

5. Learning Disruption Funding

- Grade 2s and 3s Mrs. Brownlee continues to work with Grade 2 and 3 students. It's going well. She will attend the May meeting and provided an update.
- Grade 1s The Division sent out information to schools on Thursday. We have hired Kali Hale to provide intervention for students in literacy and math. She will begin Tuesday, April 19 and will wrap up the interventions support on June 2. Kali Hale is a teacher at LLR but is on parent leave with her child. She will be returning to LLR for next year.

• The Division also provided money to schools for additional kindergarten support. A such, we have hired Taylin Janke. Taylin will begin on April 25 and will be here until the end of June. She has her EA certificate and has finished her first (of two years) as a Speech Language Pathologist Assistant. She will be a great asset.
