2. Student Enrollment

- Teachers have been asked to call every student in their class by Sept. 13 and welcome them to their class. Junior High assembly first week. Junior high saw our new gym floor. Looks great.

Current Enrollment = 771 Students (We were projected to have 763)

- Discussed Grade 5 class size being so large.
- Looking into available EA support for all classes and funding by end Sept.
- Teachers, have done wonderful job, with class sizing high looking to move some items off the plate
- Class size and EA assignments continue to be evaluated.
- Boundary exemptions are capped on large class sizes
- Councillor is half time role, shared with Sherwood Heights. Mrs. Harry is at LLR Wednesdays,
 Thursdays, and alternating Fridays. Feel ability to meet needs through flexibility and time
 allocation. Have run 2 years with a part time Councillor.
- Early learning funding (i.e., math and literacy) learning assistance does not have indication of this year for similar funding (i.e., Mrs. Brownlee's role form last year)

3. Jr. High Athletics

- Volleyball and Cross Country are underway.
- New gym flooring complete. Looks fantastic. Kids love it.

4. Cash 4 Care & Theme Days

- Each year, Lakeland Ridge School selects a charity to fundraise for on early dismissal days. We call this fundraising, Cash-for-Care.
- This year's Cash-for-Care charity is Second Chance Animal Rescue Society (SCARS). They are a non-profit Edmonton and Athabasca based registered charity. SCARS is dedicated to taking in as many homeless pets as their resources allow and providing them with the care that they need. SCARS typically has 200 animals in care and finds homes for approximately 2000 pets each year.
- If you are interested in supporting SCARS through our Cash-for-Care fundraiser, you can send money with your child or donate items on early dismissal days.
- Your child's teacher will ensure the money and items go to the office where they will be safely stored until provided to SCARS.
