• There was discussion about the need for a third teacher for the grade 6 group due to its large size again this year. Mr. Huculak and Trustee Seutter will take forward parent's concerns and desire for a third teacher for this group to the EIPS Board for advocacy.

### 4. School Education Plan Update

### Goal #1

#### SCHOOL GOAL:

By identifying essential outcomes through scope and sequence and data analysis, staff will build capacity in numeracy. Growth will be reflected using teacher-awarded marks, common unit and final exams, STAR Math analysis, and PAT data.

# *Goal # 2*

All students will demonstrate growth in common assessments administered throughout our reporting periods in December, March, and June, as a result of all staff incorporating a variety of literacy opportunities with a focus on small-group instruction.

#### Goal #3

By strengthening connections, empathy, and relationships our school community will grow together in an inclusive and safe environment as demonstrated through school-wide initiatives, as well as the EIPS Annual Feedback Surveys for staff, students, and caregivers.

#### 5. Student Voice

- Started last year.
- *Great dialogue with students. Lots of great suggestions.*
- One thing, students mentioned they like are Buddy classes.
- As such, all LLR class will be paired up with another (E.g., 7-3 with Class 1-2)
- We will have various activities throughout the year.

#### 6. Reset Room (Grades 6-9 students)

- Started mid-way through last year as pilot project. This is the 2<sup>nd</sup> year of the 2-year pilot.
- *Mr. Jap is the lead teacher for the Reset Room this year.*
- The Reset Room is located upstairs and serves as a place for students to reset and return to learning.

## 7. Cash for Care & Theme Days

- Each Early Dismissal Day we will have a theme day. September's' was "School Colour Day" and October's will be "PJ/Onesie Day". Theme Days for the year can be found on our calendar on our school website.
- Each year, Lakeland Ridge School selects a charity to fundraise for on early dismissal days. We call this fundraising, Cash-for-Care. This year's Cash-for-Care charity is Ronald McDonald House Charities (RMHC).

#### From their website:

- 1) Ronald McDonald House Charities® Alberta supports families seeking vital medical treatment for their seriously sick or injured child. Our warm, compassionate Houses provide a home-away-from-home for families who need to travel for medical reasons. When those families are experiencing one of life's most difficult times, we offer them the gift of togetherness.
- 2) Since the first Houses were built in Alberta in 1985, we have supported tens of thousands of families. Every year, thousands will stay at one of Alberta's Ronald McDonald Houses. These stays can last up to a few nights, or as long as several weeks or months at a time.
- 3) Each Ronald McDonald House has private family suites for families to rest. The Houses have open kitchens where families can sit down and share experiences over a homemade meal. The sense of community enables families to rely on each other and shore up strength.
- 4) Almost 70% of Canadian families live outside of a community with a children's hospital, meaning they will need to travel to access medical care. Ronald McDonald Houses save families millions of dollars

- each year on accommodation, transportation, meals, laundry, parking, and more. Having a Ronald McDonald House close to a hospital in Alberta is an important part of family-centred care.
- 5) RMHC Alberta serves families largely from across the province, from almost 300 Albertan communities. From Wood Buffalo to Lethbridge, and Grande Prairie to Lloydminster, families come from all corners and corridors of Alberta to stay at a Ronald McDonald House.

Calgary: 32 suites, open 1985 Edmonton: 38 suites, open 1985 Red Deer: 11 suites, open 2012 Medicine Hat: 6 suites, open 2020

If you are interested in supporting RMHC through our Cash-for-Care fundraiser, you can send money with your child or donate items on early dismissal days or you can donate online. The link can be found on our website and depending on the size of your donation RMHC may issue you a tax receipt. Your child's teacher will ensure the money and items go to the office.

#### 8. Linking Generations & Grandparent Program

- o Linking Generations is for our Junior High students.
  - o Paired up with Chartwell Retirement Residence.
  - Representatives from LG will be coming to LLR on Sept. 14 to speak to junior high kids and explain the program.
  - o Junior High students need to apply to get in. This year they have about 17 seniors, so will be looking for about 34 students.
  - o First visit September 28
  - Lunch Hour 12:24 pm to 1:24 pm (Students dismissed from class around noon to eat before boarding the bus)
  - o Depart for Chartwell Emerald Hills 12:30 pm, arrive to Chartwell at 12:35 pm
  - o Linking Generations Visit 12:30 to 1:30 pm (60 minutes)
  - Students depart Chartwell Emerald Hills, bus leaves at 1:35 pm, arrive back to school at 1:35 pm (just after the start of Block 5
  - Meet 2x a month, with last visit end of April. Will visit about 16 teams this year.
- o Grandparent Program
  - The Grandparent program pairs up independent seniors with classes in K-6.
  - o 10 schools in the program. There are about 70 seniors to place.
  - o Seniors must volunteer at least 1.5 hours per month but can certainly do more.
  - Teachers were asked to apply if they are interested. So far, we know Mrs. McKay will have a couple of seniors working with her classes again this year. Still waiting to hear about others.
